Subject: Caitlin Abbott

Caitlin Abbott worked for Bay of Plenty Regional Council as Summer Intern from November 2021 through February 2022, in the Transport and Urban Planning Team.

We engaged Caitlin to specifically utilise her skills and learnings in architecture. The project that she was given for her internship was to explore, develop and theme a design for bus 'shelter' infrastructure, i.e., a design of bus shelter that placed the user in the western Bay of Plenty, and which could be scaled at single street-side bus shelter; small hub shelters/on-street super-stop shelter facilities through to a city centre interchange. We also wanted her to bring green architecture principles into a (durable) shelter infrastructure. No small task!

At the end of the summer Caitlin gave a formal presentation of her portfolio to the combined Transport & Urban Planning and PT Operations Teams, with other staff being an audience of 30+. The audience was universally and overwhelmingly impressed. A staff member, who had recently worked in a multi-disciplinary consultancy (planners, architects and engineers), commented that her work was easily equal to work his consultancy would have delivered in fulfilment of a professional engagement. Suffice to say, I totally and fully recommend the quality and accomplishment of Caitlin's work. However, anyone who is considering Caitlin for an architectural role will quickly see this competency for themselves. Therefore, I note the circumstances of Caitlin's Summer Internship at Regional Council, and Caitlin's particular attributes.

Caitlin's internship was more akin to an architecture 'commission' than a typical internship where she might have worked alongside a seasoned professional giving guidance or directing her output. Quite the opposite, no-one at Regional Council 'normally' designs bus infrastructure, nor does anyone in the team have an architectural background or training. Essentially, Caitlin worked to a 'brief' with minimal supervision for an 'unintelligent' client. As noted above, she excelled.

The summer of 2021/22 BOP RC day-to-day office situation was heavily impacted by COVID. Much of the team was hybrid-working; the availability of team members, including myself, was variously impacted by different Alert Levels in the Bay of Plenty, Waikato and Auckland, and there were changing isolation requirements, including for one "super-spreader" event that Caitlin herself attended, (that wasn't). It was an unusual and often uncertain time for those of us for whom Regional Council is, literally, our day job. Yet, and for what I understand was her first 'office job', Caitlin showed herself to be resilient, self-motivated, diligent and conscientious, easily coping with the changing situations while continuing to deliver. Caitlin proved to be flexible, and mature — beyond her working years, in that she would work independently but seek help as needed; she would agree deadlines and deliver on them; she would 'signal ahead' respecting that other team members had different priorities/focus if she was needing input for her work. Caitlin would 'check back' confirming her understanding was correct, if / when we gave her vague or ambiguous feedback or instructions. As a manager I appreciated this in an employee, avoiding as it did wasted effort, and doubtless frustration, on both sides; and surely an imperative for an architect(?)

Also, it needs to be mentioned, Caitlin is simply the loveliest person to have in an office, friendly, mild-mannered, polite, respectful, fun, engaged and engaging (I could exhaust the Thesaurus

here). It was a pleasure to have Caitlin in our team. If the opportunity arose, would I employ her again? Yes. Do I recommend to her to any potential future employers? Absolutely.
